Please note that there were hundreds of volunteer hours contributed into this three-day event. The Klamath Falls City Schools also provided staff and resources that are not reflected above. This includes time from staff, teachers, and maintenance. *For example:*

The Co-Chairs for the celebration *Mike Herron* and *Gayle Yamasaki* volunteered their time for this project from January-October 2019. *Dan Stearns* volunteered his time to create the KUHS celebration documentary video and radio spots. He and Gayle designed of all of the 1928-2019 posters (10) and the celebration program and design. Gayle and Mike worked with the Herald and News for the insert. Dan and Gayle worked with the design of the Pelican logo stickers (4) and stand-up Pelican Pete's (2) for the celebration. Music teachers *Wendy Savage*, *Brett Aaker*, and *Kayla McPherson* had their students perform during the celebration, opening, receptions, and breakfast. Theatre teacher *Lindsay Stratton* had her students perform monologues during the celebration tours in the theatre. Maintenance crew picked and returned acoustic shells for the band and choir performances, and display cases from the Klamath County Museum.

Students and community members volunteered 100's of hours of their time for this celebration.

For example:

Klamath County Museum Director *Todd Kepple* presented the history of KUHS at the KFCS Board sponsored breakfast. *Jesse Wilder* from Klamath Film Festival worked with Pelican Cinema to show James Ivory's film Room With a View. Pelican Cinema donated the theatre for the Saturday night showing of James's movie. Chartwell's food services Director *David Bates* prepared the sponsored breakfast. *Running Y* and the *Cerulean* lodge and hotel provided discounted rooms for the celebration. Herald and News staff *Holly Owens, Jerry O'Brien, Holly Dillemuth,* and *Lee Juillerat* created the H&N insert of KUHS. *Larry Turner* photographer provided/donated photos of James Ivory. Former KUHS art teacher *James Beene* worked with us on the former art teacher and alumni art show where over 50 pieces of original artwork were on display. *Dave Hamm* KUHS former choir director (1970) volunteered to direct and coordinate with over 46 former KUHS A cappella choir members from 1970-1980 who live all across the country. Dave and his wife, KUHS alum, traveling from Florida to perform and attend the celebration. *Ken White* former band director volunteered his time to work with the 24 alumni and current former KFCS band

teachers and community members to perform at this celebration. *KUHS culinary students* baked cupcakes for the celebration reception (200). And *KUHS media students*' set-up the photo display and took photos for attendees and video interviews during the day. Students hosted tables where 92 years of yearbooks were available free celebration posters, magazine and H&N publications and the purchase of commemorative bricks and theatre seats. The *Pelican Education Foundation* and their Board members distributed free KUHS keepsake bricks, stickers, and brochures about the Foundation. Former KFCS Board Chair *Bill Jennings* was the master of ceremonies for the Saturday event while *Allison York* and *Dick Ledgerwood* former co-chairs of the KFSC bond team was speaker's. Lastly the Lake Euwana *Wingwatcher's, Lake Euwana Row* club, and the *Klamath County Museum* provided Sunday morning activities for this event.

- 4. Our marketing dollars from the Klamath County tourism grant funds were spent on the design and printing of materials which included, invitations and RSVP's, mailing/postage of invitations, downtown banner, downtown flags. The matching funds dollars for marketing went to save the date postcards and postage, Home and Outdoor Magazine, hanging of downtown banner and flags, and printing of celebration programs, and alumni and James Ivory Arts Center celebrations posters.
- 5. Marketing that was most successful included the direct mail of save the date postcards and invitations, dedicated celebration email address and Facebook page. These marketing pieces gave us contact with out of state alumni. The KUHS celebration documentary video gave the history of the school, profiling classes since 1930's as well as a preview of the new campus.

The least successful radio ads that were on air week of September 23-29, 2019 and the Heard and News insert, October 2, 2019. These pieces were not as timely to prompt out of town participation, as we would have liked.

- 6. We estimated at least 85 plus participants were from out of county.
- 7. This estimate was determined by the number of choir and band alumni from the classes of 1970-1980 who came and performed during the celebration program. In addition we have email documentation from out of county attendees. We also have anecdotal information from out of county attendees who stayed at the Running Y lodge and in downtown motels, Cerulean and Maverick.
- 8. The days of the celebration October 4-6, 2019. The main ribbon cutting and dedication occurred on Saturday, October 5th. We estimate that visitors stayed a minimum of one night and a maximum of three.

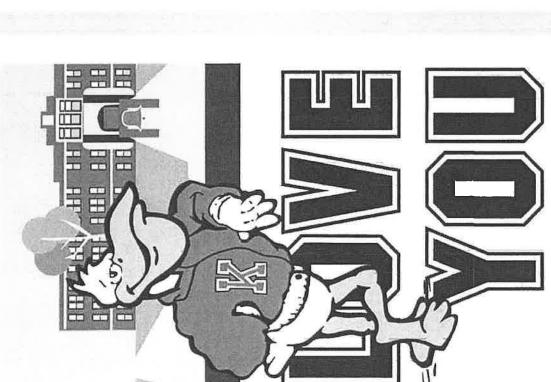
9. The extra days were determined by the number of attendees at the Homecoming football game the night of October 4^{th} and the number of attendees for Sunday morning events October 6^{th} .

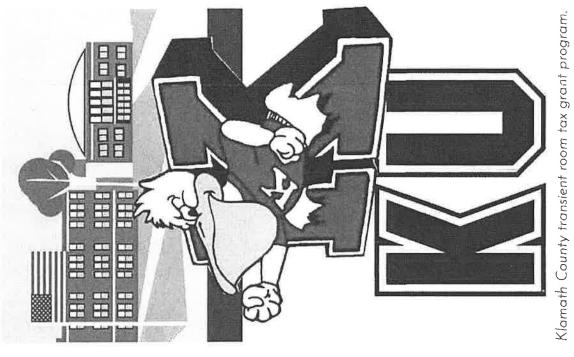

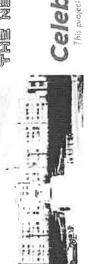

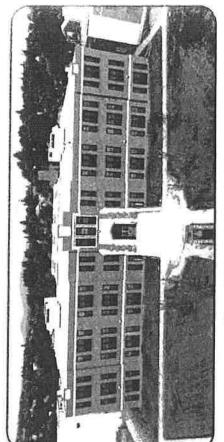
